Hebert Law Center, Trosclair entered public service early in her career with the 22nd Judicial District Public Defender's Office, where she represented clients in criminal, juvenile, misdemeanor, and non-support matters before later supervising several divisions within the office. She has extensive jury and bench trial experience and has spent her career working in nearly every facet of the courtroom.

From 2016 until stepping down to seek election as Judge, Trosclair served as Hearing Officer for the 22nd Judicial District Court, where she presided over child support and family-related matters while helping ensure the efficient operation of the court. She is also among the first attorneys in Louisiana to earn certification as a Child Welfare Law Specialist, reflecting her longstanding commitment to protecting children and strengthening families.

In addition to her legal career, Trosclair has demonstrated a longstanding commitment to the community. She currently serves as President of the 22nd Judicial District Bar Association and President of the Junior League of Greater Covington and has held leadership roles with East St. Tammany Habitat for Humanity, the Louisiana Support Enforcement Association, Good Samaritan Ministries, Girls on the Run Southeast Louisiana, and the Slidell Women's Civic Club. She is also a graduate of Leadership St. Tammany.

"Throughout my career, I've had the privilege of serving this community in many different roles, and each one has reinforced my belief that experience matters. The people of St. Tammany and Washington Parishes deserve a judge who comes prepared on day one, applies the law fairly, manages the courtroom professionally, and treats every person with dignity and respect. I believe my experience has prepared me to do exactly that, and I would be honored to continue serving this community as its next District Judge."
